On Sunday, January 22, 2023, we will celebrate **SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD** throughout the Eparchy of St. Josaphat.

The Sunday of the Word of God was instituted by Pope Francis to be held every year to remind pastors and faithful alike, of the importance and value of Sacred Scripture for the Christian life, as well as the relationship between the Word of God and the liturgy.

“As Christians, we are one people, making our pilgrim way through history, sustained by the Lord, present in our midst, who speaks to us and nourishes us. A day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year-long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the Risen Lord, who continues to speak His word and to break bread in the community of believers. For this reason, we need to develop a closer relationship with Sacred Scripture; otherwise, our hearts will remain cold and our eyes shut, inflicted as we are by so many forms of blindness”. Funeral services for Bishop John Bura will be celebrated on January 23-24, 2023 at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Philadelphia. 830 N Franklin St, Philadelphia, PA 19123

Bishop Bura’s body will lie in state for viewing and prayer starting on at 2 p.m. on Monday, January 23rd at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. The Episcopal Parastas will be held the same day at 4:30 p.m.

A funeral Divine liturgy will be celebrated on Tuesday, January 24 at 9:30 a.m. After the Liturgy, the remains of Bishop Bura will be transferred to St. Andrew Cemetery in Bound Brook, NJ for internment.

The services will be open to the public and all clergy religious and faithful are encouraged to spiritually accompany Bishop John on his last journey.
