The Kobzar's Prayer for Ukraine, featuring Jurij Fedynskyj:

He is going to perform at our Church on July 3rd after the Divine Liturgy

About the performer:

Jurij Fedynskyj was born in North Carolina to Ukrainian parents who had reluctantly left their homeland to escape Soviet oppression. Following the breakup of the USSR, he felt drawn to reconnect with his roots, and, at the age of 23, relocated to Kyiv in order to pursue a career in Ukrainian folklore. There, he learned bandura, kobzar skills, and instrument-building techniques from numerous folk artists. Eventually settling in the small village of Krachkyvka, in the Poltava region of central Ukraine, a historical center of kobzar activity, he started a family, and has built a successful career as a performer, instrument builder, teacher, festival director, and founder of the Poltava Kobzar Guild. Upon the Russian invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, Jurij decided to use his skills to contribute to the national defense in a remarkably different way. Joining together with a small group of fellow musicians, for three months he traveled to some of the hardest-hit zones of the country, performing daily for those sheltering from the destruction, as well as for soldiers guarding the front lines. In this way, their little "kobzar armada" did their part to counter the horror and violence of war by using their music to provide a traumatized populace with solace and spiritual sustenance.
