Church history...

The Beginnings of Christianity in Kyivan Rus'... Subsequently, the holy brothers were blessed for a mission by both Popes Adrian II and John VII (872-882). Historians, however, are still debating the detailed scope of the jurisdiction of the Slavic hierarchy of Great Moravia. In fact, its influence on the Christianization of the contemporary Transcarpathian and Galician territories of Western Ukraine is quite unlikely. There is a hypothesis that the beginnings of the ancient Eparchy of Peremyshl may date back to the time of St. Methodius' archbishopric, but there is not enough conclusive evidence. After their banishment from Moravia, the Cyril and Methodius' disciples settled in the neighboring Kingdom of Bulgaria, whose borders included part of the present-day southwestern Ukraine. Thus, at some point, the Cyril and Methodius tradition actually did have influence on Rus' due to these Slavic enlighteners' disciples and their writings coming from Bulgaria. An account of the glorious activity of these, Equal to the Apostles, can be found in the Tale of Bygone Years also known as the Primary Chronicle. The Chronicle tells us of the existence of the Christian church of St. Elias in Kyiv at the time of Prine Ihor in 944. This indicates, that though not being an officially Christian state, Rus' was not entirely pagan at that time. Christian preaching penetrated these lands through trade and international contacts. An important milestone of the spread of Christianity in Ruthenian lands was the baptism of Princess regent Olha in 954/55.
